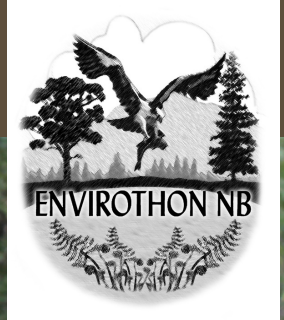

## ANNUAL COMPETITION 2021

### *Envirothon NB Goes Virtual*

Envirothon NB is an experiential environmental and natural resources problem-solving competition that builds leadership skills for high school students, grades 9-12.

During the first week of May 2021, Envirothon NB will host the competition online. Participating teams will put their training to the test in four natural resource categories: Soils/Land Use, Aquatic Ecology, Wildlife, and Forestry followed by oral presentations on their solution to the 2021 Current Environmental Issue - Water Resource Management. The week will include student engagement activities and culminate with a celebration event announcing the results.

Combining in-class curriculum and hands-on field experiences, the Envirothon NB program is an excellent way to supplement environmental education inside and outside the traditional classroom. Envirothon NB participants gain valuable knowledge and training in ecology and natural resource management principles and practices.

Teams consist of up to five students from the same school, non-traditional school or youth organization led by advisors (teachers, parents, or volunteers). Resource materials and virtual workshops are provided to assist teams in their preparation for the provincial competition in May.

Each year, more than 25,000 students in Canada, USA, and China participate in the Envirothon program. Envirothon was started in 1979 by three Pennsylvania soil and water conservation districts. Nova Scotia became the first Canadian province to participate in Envirothon in 1993. It also hosted the 2000 international Envirothon competition at Acadia University in Wolfville, where New Brunswick took part in its first Envirothon. In 2023, New Brunswick will proudly host the international NCF-Envirothon competition for the second time.
